Your itinerary

Santiago to Cape Finisterre

6 days self-guided walk with on the ground support

87km - Santiago – Negreira – Olveiroa – Cee – Cape Finisterre

13 Jun: Santiago de Compostela

Make your own way to the hotel in Santiago. Meals: NIL

14 Jun: Walk via the Alto do Mar das Ovelhas to Negreira

(22km/6.5hrs) Leaving Santiago's cathedral behind you, the walk starts downhill to the pretty hamlet of Ponte Maceira straddling the river Tambre. From the stone bridge over the river, the trail continues to the medieval village of Negreira. Meals: B, D

15 Jun: Continue across hills and through valleys to Olveiroa

(31km/9 or 7hrs) You will appreciate the rural Galician landscape on today's long journey through agricultural regions. You will pass a number of small villages and churches on the way to your accommodation in the small township of Olveiroa.

Note: A morning (9am) taxi transfer is possible to reduce the walking distance by 10km, to 7hrs. If requested at time of booking the transfer is included. Or you can arrange it locally yourself, the cost is approx EUR20. Meals: B, D

16 Jun: Walk through pine groves and past monasteries to Cee

(18km/5.5hrs) Today's path leads you through the mountains to your first exhilarating views of the sea. You then follow the trail downhill to the coastal village of Cee, and the old town of Corcubion nearby. Meals: B, D

17 Jun: The final stage to the sea at Cape Finisterre

(16km/3.5hrs) Today you will pass many beaches of fine sand and even walk along the beach itself on the way in to the fishing village of Finisterre. From here you will continue to the cape and the lighthouse, the perfect place to stop and contemplate the beauty that surrounds you at the 'end of the earth'. You will stay the night here in charming accommodation overlooking the Atlantic. Meals: B, D

18 Jun: Trip concludes after breakfast. There is an option to continue on to Muxia (see extended itinerary below). Meals: B

Optional, two-day Extension to Muxia

19 Jun: Continue from Cape Finisterre to Lires (13km, 3hrs) The walk today from Fisterra heads towards San Martiño de Duio. You will pass several hamlets with genuine samples of the rural and religious architecture of Romanesque origin to then get to Punta do Rostro and from there to Lires, where you will overnight in the small town. This would be day 6 of the itinerary. Meals: B, D

20 Jun: On to Muxia, trip concludes (17km, 4hrs) From Lires the trail heads up to As Aférras with views to the coast. You then continue through Lourido Beach towards the town of Muxía, the final destination of the Camino. Tour concluded on arrival in Muxia. NOTE: You can catch an afternoon bus back to Santiago, or a private transfer can be arranged for you (at an extra cost). It is also possible to arrange an extra night of accommodation in Muxia. This would be day 7 of the itinerary. Meals: B



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
